Pool Rules that will be watched carefully are:

- All guests must be accompanied by a resident.
- Children under 14 years of age must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

Because of the shortage of lifeguards, attendants are filling in. They are NOT lifeguards. They are present to check Residents/Guests in and out and to make sure rules are being followed. The age group 14-17 will still be allowed to swim without an adult present. If they do not follow the rules, they will lose that status and their privilege of coming alone will be suspended. They can NOT bring someone under the age of 14.

- NO running on pool/patio decks.
- NO riding scooters, bikes, roller skates, etc. of any type on patio deck or in the multicourts.
- Children not toilet trained are permitted in the wading pool ONLY and must have rubber/plastic pants over diaper. Swimwear required.
- NO strollers allowed on the pool deck.
- NO eating on the pool deck. ALL food must remain on the patio deck.
- ONLY water is allowed on the pool deck in a plastic container. Any other drink is strictly prohibited.
- NO smoking or vaping allowed on the patio or pool deck. If a Resident/Guest smokes there is a receptacle by the north side of the trash bin.
- If you would like to listen to your own music, please wear your headphones. Clubhouse music is the only music that ONLY music that should be heard.

If rules are not respected, there will be a system of consequences. A warning letter from Management/the Board will be issued stating the offense and asking the Resident to appear at the next Board Meeting. The hearing results could lead to pool suspensions for a period of time.

REMINDERS
